DBL Returns to Colombia

Maria Immaculata School & Shelter in Anapoima, Colombia is one of *Delivering Better Lives* newest projects and recommended by *Eduardo Vargas* and the UTi Bogota team. The school is located approximately one hour from the capital city of Bogota and was established ten years ago by a family who identified a need to help those in the community. The facility houses an educational center and shelter for children and young adults who cannot function in mainstream schooling or who have been abandoned, neglected or come from impoverished backgrounds.

While the center is approved by the government, they receive no funding and rely purely on donations. The strong and passionate management team at the center has developed an educational model to help the students learn English and gain full-time employment upon completion of their schooling.

DBL will provide fencing and security for the center as well as construct an outdoor meeting area and kitchen. We are also considering the purchase of a plot of adjoining land that would allow the center to expand its services.


Rosh Hashanah Celebrations

2012 DBL Project Shows Positive Impact

Alice Ng, UTi Human Resource Manager in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia recently paid a visit to the Ampang Girls Shelter in Selangor, Malaysia to see how the shelter benefited from work *DBL* undertook there in 2012. The shelter is run by the Sisters of the Good Shepherd to provide care and accommodation to young women who have been abused or are at risk of abuse. *DBL* funded and managed building renovations that ensure a caring and comfortable place to live for the young people who so desperately need support.



The new shelter not only provides the girls with refuge and safety, but also opportunities to gain an education and develop in a protected environment.



Alice was pleased to report that many of the girls helped by the *DBL* project have now graduated high school and are living a healthy and happy life. One girl, whose story highlights the importance of the work DBL undertakes, not only graduated from high school but is continuing studies to obtain a Diploma in Physiotherapy.

Currently, there are 13 happy smiling girls staying at the shelter whose futures look as bright as the young girl with a future in physiotherapy.



UTi Mexico Continues DBL Support for Casa Hogar Tepeyac

Mari Corona, UTi Branch Manager of Guadalajara, organized a collection of funds to ensure the girls of Casa Hogar Tepeyac had the necessary items to undertake their education. The items included notebooks, pencils, coloring pencils, books, etc. The cost of supplying the children with these necessary tools was merely USD 70, or for some of us a new pair of shoes! As Gilberto Rivera, UTi Vice President of Area Sales for Latina America said "Sometimes we don't need to wait for a Walkathon or donate a big amount of money to make a difference in the life of others."

Subsequent to this visit Hessel Verhage, UTi President for the Americas Region (pictured below left) and Jim Rinchiuso, UTi Americas VP of Ocean Services (pictured right) joined Gilberto Rivera (center) on a trip to Casa Hogar Tepeyac and as can be seen from this photographs had an amazing experience with the children. In a message regarding their trip Hessel stated:



"Truly one of the most powerful moments of my life, these little girls just craved human touch and were literally standing in line to be hugged. Amazing experience I literally laughed and cried in the same hour."

This statement proves that **Delivering Better Lives** is not only about money but about giving of ourselves and letting others know that there are people who care and have the time for them.
